



# DOUBLE RUBY RING

*an English Paper Piecing pattern*

## Bonus Projects Instructions

Although the Double Ruby Ring pattern is labeled as Intermediate, I've discovered there are several ways to use the pieces to practice and build up your skill to tackle the full block! If you are newer to EPP or just want more mileage out of this pattern, these projects are for you!

The first project just uses the large ring pieces. EPPing with just the large ring pieces means no curves! So if this is your first EPP project, I recommend trying this one first! The second and third project use the center and small ring pieces. These are gentle curves and are the perfect place to begin your curved EPP journey!

On the next pages, there are instructions for these three bonus patterns. Hope you enjoy!

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## Large Rings Wall Hanging

Finished size 32"x32"

### Fabric Requirements

1 yard for background

An assortment of small scraps for the large ring pieces

Binding and Backing fabric for wall hanging

### Cutting

Cut (16) 8 1/2" square blocks from the background fabric

### EPP pieces

(16) each of the pieces to make a large ring (1a-6a and 1b-6b)

### Instructions

1. Use EPP to make a large ring using pieces 1a-6a and 1b-6b. Repeat until you have made 16 large rings.
2. Press each block and then remove papers. Press again. When removing papers and pressing pieces 1a, 1b, 6a, and 6b, open the seam allowances on the edges not connected to the ring.
3. Line up the large ring in the center of the 8 1/2" square and pin in place.
4. If any of the seam allowance from pieces 1a, 1b, 6a, and 6b extended over the edge of the square, trim it off.
5. Applique (by hand or by machine) the sides of the large ring to the 8 1/2" square.
6. Sew the squares together using a scant 1/4" seam.
7. Follow pattern instructions for finishing the wall hanging.





## Orange Peels Mini Quilt or Cushion

Finished size 20"x20"

### Fabric Requirements

1/3 yard for background

An assortment of small scraps for the orange peel blocks

Binding and Backing fabric for mini quilt

### Cutting

Cut (16) 5" squares from the background fabric

### EPP pieces

(16) each of the small ring (center and 1c-6c)

### Instructions

1. Use EPP to create an orange peel block with the center piece and small ring pieces (1c-6c) (see page 9 in the pattern for diagram). Repeat until you have (16) orange peel blocks total.
2. Press each block and then remove papers. Press again. When removing papers and pressing pieces 1c and 6c, open the seam allowances on the edges not connected to the ring.
3. Line up those edges with the corners of a 5" square.
4. Applique (by hand or by machine) the outer sides of the ring to the 5" square.
5. Sew the squares together using a 1/4" seam allowance.
6. Follow pattern instructions for finishing the mini quilt or find your favorite online tutorial if you want to turn it into a quilted cushion.



## Orange Peel Flowers Baby Quilt

Finished size 30"x40"

### Fabric Requirements

1 1/4 yards for background

An assortment of small scraps for the orange peel pieces

Binding and Backing fabric for quilt

### Cutting

Cut (12) 10 1/2" square blocks from the background fabric

### EPP pieces

(48) each of the small ring (center and 1c-6c)

### Instructions

1. Use EPP to create an orange peel block with the center piece and small ring pieces (1c-6c) (see page 9 in the pattern for diagram). Repeat until you have (48) orange peel blocks total.
2. Press each block and then remove papers. Press again.
3. Place (4) orange peel blocks together on top of a 10 1/2" square. Arrange into flower shape in the center of the square. Pin pieces down.
4. Applique (by hand or by machine) each orange peel to the 10 1/2" square
5. Sew the squares together using a 1/4" seam allowance.
6. Follow pattern instructions for finishing the baby quilt.
